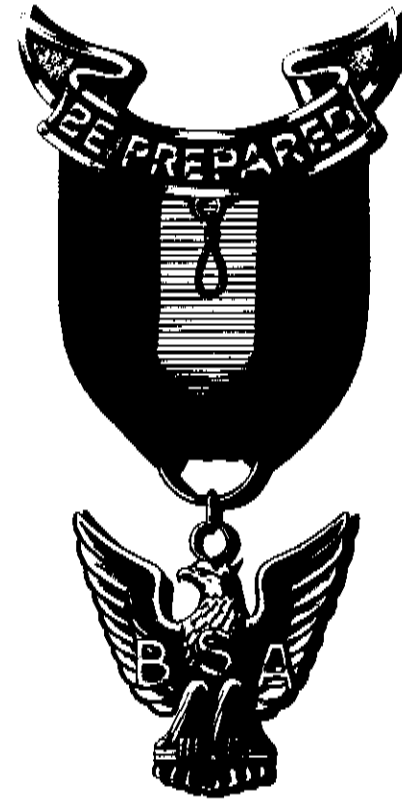

EAGLE SCOUT BOBBY W. HICKSON

1. EAGLE SCOUT: The troop extends its most sincere congratulations to Bobby W. Hickson upon his achieving the Boy Scouts of America's highest award, The Eagle Award. The troop is extremely proud of Bobby.

The Eagle Award was presented to Bobby by his Mother, Mrs. Nancy Hickson, during ceremonies held at the Scout Lodge on 31 May 1989. The Eagle Certificate was presented to Bobby by his Father, Mr. Patrick J. Hickson.

2. **SUMMER SCHEDULE:** Troop 99 will begin its annual summer schedule on 1 June 1989. This year we will begin a month early. In the past we suspended weekly meetings during July and August due to vacations, summer jobs, and other summer oriented activities which greatly reduced the number of scouts available for weekly meetings and activities. These activities took a heavy toll on troop membership last June and this month our total membership is lower than last June. Based upon this, it was decided this summer vacation would begin in June.

During the summer vacation months a campout, a field trip, or a combination of both, will be held monthly. Prior to planning, a poll will be made to determine the number of scouts available on a specific date and an alternate date. If sufficient scouts are available, then the activity will be planned. Families will be notified by mail as to the activity with all the details. If on the other hand, there is insufficient interest that particular month then no activity will be planned.

3. **RESUMPTION OF TROOP MEETINGS:** The troop will resume normal weekly meetings on 6 September 1989. The meetings will be held in the Scout Lodge at Scout Lake.

4. **WELCOME:** The adult leadership and scouts of Troop 99 extend a warm and hearty welcome to our three new scouts and look forward to a long and pleasant association with them.

Nelson Simmons entered the troop from Pack 96, Fort Gordon. He received his neckerchief, Tenderfoot Badge and the Citizenship and Family Living Skill Awards from Assistant Scoutmaster Jason Cho and Den Chief Timothy Tucker during the Pack meeting held on 25 May 1989. Nelson earned the Arrow of Light and the skill awards prior to entering the troop which qualified him for the rank of Tenderfoot.

Marcus C. Todd transferred from Troop 203, Fort Bliss, Texas on 31 May 1989. He has earned Star Scout Rank and is ready to work towards Life Scout. Marcus is a member of the Order of the Arrow.

Michael C. Todd, the brother of Marcus, was active in Troop 51, Frankfurt, Germany and presently is a Life Scout. He is working on his qualifications for Eagle Scout. He is also a member of the Order of the Arrow.

5. **DEPARTURES:** The troop regretfully announces the loss of two of its members;

Timothy C. Tucker, our Assistant Senior Patrol Leader, departs for Seattle, Washington where he will take up residence. Tim has been with the troop since March 1983 and attained the rank of Star Scout. He is a member of the Order of the Arrow and served as Den Chief for Pack 96.

Bob Texas departed the 4th of June when he reached 18 years of age, the maximum age for Boy Scouts. Bob has served as the Senior Patrol Leader for the troop and attained the rank of Life Scout.

The troop wishes both Bob and Tim the very best in their future endeavors and hopes they will continue in the scouting program, Tim in Seattle and Bob with a local Explorer Post.

6. TROOP DUES: Troop dues during the period 1 June - 2 September 1989 are suspended and no dues will be collected during this period. Regular weekly dues will begin on 6 September 1989 and will remain at \$0.50 per week.



7. MERIT BADGES/SKILL AWARDS: Scouts desiring Merit Badge/Skill Award Study Guides during the summer break may contact the scoutmaster at 793-6062. He will obtain the necessary manuals and study guides for them from the troop library. Any scout who desires help, or passed off on an award, during the summer may contact the scoutmaster who will be available to give them assistance.

8. SCOUT SHOW TICKETS: The troop received a check in the amount of \$13.75 from the Georgia-Carolina Council as our share of the ticket sales for the recent annual scout show held on 13 May 1989. This represents the sale of 55 tickets by troop members. The top salesman for the troop was Frank Irvine who sold 35 tickets. Joe Heffern and Armando Llamas tied for second place with the sale of 10 tickets each. All three scouts received the scout show pocket patch with sales tab and Frank chose a Foam Sleeping Pad as his prize for selling 35 tickets. Congratulations for a job well done go to Frank, Joe and Armando.

9. SUMMER CAMP: Upon recommendation of the Council Camping Committee, Boy Scout Summer Camp will be conducted for one week only during 9 - 15 July 1989. The number of troop reservations as of 31 May did not warrant the economical operation of the originally scheduled first and third weeks of summer camp. Provisional Troop accommodations for the week of July 9th can still be made. Interested parents may contact the Scoutmaster at 793-6062, or, the Georgia-Carolina Council at 826-4471. The cost of the week of summer camp is \$85.00. The Provisional Troop is established for scouts who wish to attend summer camp on an individual basis. Experienced reliable adult leadership is provided for the provisional troop with the youth leadership being selected from the youth members of the provisional troop. The summer camp is held at Camp Linwood-Haynes which is approximately a twenty minute drive from the Fort Gordon area.

10. (ADDED) PAPER SALES: Effective immediately, Troop 99 will no longer collect newspapers. In recent months, due to an apparent national effort to recycle newsprint, the market has been flooded with newsprint thus dropping the price paid by dealers to \$0.25 per hundred pounds for newsprint. We were selling our recyclable newspaper at \$1.50 per hundred pounds up to several months ago when it suddenly dropped to \$0.50 per one hundred pounds. At that time dealers were often reluctant to purchase the newsprint as they had an abundant supply on hand and were not getting a good price for it. They expressed a belief that the price would not go up in the distant future and predicted it might drop even lower. It just did!

Our operation was not a large one but it was quite profitable for the troop while the price was at \$1.50 per hundred pounds. The troop had a number of people throughout the Fort Gordon-Augusta-Martinez area who provide a sufficient amount of paper to the troop to make this a worthwhile effort.

As a result of the flooded paper market and the low price offered for the paper, it has been decided the effort is now economically undesirable in terms of time, gasoline, and profit. If and when there is a change in the market, the collection of newsprint will again become a project for the troop.

Monies received from paper sales has kept the troop alive financially over the years. It is now time to look towards another means of making money which will maintain the troop financially. An immediate project for consideration is the collection of Aluminum cans. At present they can be sold for \$0.50 per pound. Other money making projects should be considered and the troop is open for suggestions.
